



The Facility

Chubb International Shooting Park will be situated on (15) acres in Southern Northumberland County, Pennsylvania and is just (2) miles West of Pillow, Pennsylvania. This pristine site is part of Martz's Gap View Hunting Preserves larger 1,300 acres tract and has been in operation as a family run business since the 1950's. The shooting park presently encompasses plans for two (fully covered) fields with the possible inclusion of more in the future. This range is also conveniently located close to both a regional airport (Harrisburg International Airport) as well as a major international airport (Philadelphia International Airport) to better serve the convenience of our patrons.

The shooting park will be the first "Fully Automated" Olympic Shotgun range in not only the United States, but the entire world. Operated on a key card system, this benefit allows our patrons to train at a time and frequency which meets their schedule. Olympic shooting athletes and enthusiasts from all over the United States will have the opportunity to train in an uninhibited and constructive environment at a range complex that will offer readiness 365 days a year.

Athletes and competitors wishing to train over a longer period of time will have on-site lodging available with all the modern conveniences available to them that they would enjoy at a normal hotel.
